Homework item #26

Prepare a note, in liaison with Total Environment, to clarify how the buffers/restoration areas have been established, including the 250m distance from corridors and stepping stones, and the extent of involvement of local and/or national partnerships in defining these.

- 1. The Council has liaised with the Total Environment team in producing this note.
- 2. In respect of restoration areas, included within the Cheshire East Ecological Network map, the selection of a 250m buffer (referred to on page 4 of [ED 09]) was made on the basis of professional judgement of qualified ecologists within the Total Environment team. Professional judgement was applied in the absence of any standardised guidance.
- 3. As noted in the report, it is acknowledged that the 250m is a generalised measurement, however it does recognise the typical dispersal distance of characteristic Cheshire species, such as Great crested newts.
- 4. Buffer zones within the network were identified following the methodology detailed on pages 2 and 3 of the report and include areas between and around the individual component sites that make up the Core Areas.
- 5. It can be confirmed that the Local Nature Partnership board was consulted during the development of the Ecological Network.

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
