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1. Introduction

- 1.1 This document is the Local Plan Monitoring Framework ("LPMF") [ED 54]. It lists the monitoring indicators that will appear in the Council's yearly Authority Monitoring Report¹ ("AMR"), and replaces the Monitoring Framework in Table 16.1 of the Local Plan Strategy ("LPS").²
- 1.2 The AMR seeks to:
 - establish what has occurred in the Borough and how trends may be changing
 - consider the extent to which Local Plan policies are being achieved
 - determine whether changes to policies or targets are necessary and whether these are significant enough to prompt a formal review to the Local Plan

2. Development of the LPMF

- 2.1 This LPMF has been produced to outline how policies in the Local Plan will be monitored. As Local Plan policies are updated and changes are made to national guidance and legislation, the LPMF must also be responsive to change. The set of indicators and targets included in Table 16.1 of the LPS and the latest AMR have been reviewed and updated with those presented in Section 4 of this document.
- 2.2 As part of the review and update of indicators and targets, the policies in the LPS and Revised Publication Draft Site Allocations and Development Policies Document ("SADPD") were considered, with appropriate performance measures against which to assess their successful implementation identified, using those contained in Table 16.1 of the LPS and the latest AMR where appropriate. This meant that some existing indicators were deleted and some renamed to make it clearer as to what they were monitoring. However, it is considered that this has led to a more robust LPMF. This process also led to the identification of new indicators and targets. The indicators used in the Sustainability Appraisal Scoping Report June 2017³ were also subject to review, with the intention that they would be used to monitor the significant effects of the Local Plan.
- 2.3 The use of a separate document to define the LPMF, instead of incorporating it into the Revised Publication Draft SADPD, allows for greater flexibility and more robust Local Plan monitoring mechanisms, enabling the LPMF to adapt to changes in national guidance and legislation as well as Local Plan policies and monitoring practices. It will also enable the identification of additional indicators to meet the monitoring requirements of future Local Plan documents, such as the Minerals and Waste Development Plan Document, without the need to review the SADPD.

3. Structure of the LPMF

- 3.1 The LPS (pp44 to 46) contains four Strategic Priorities that form the basis of the structure for the LPMF:
 - Strategic Priority 1: Promoting economic prosperity by creating conditions for business growth
 - Strategic Priority 2: Creating sustainable communities, where all members are able to contribute and where all the infrastructure required to support the community is provided
 - Strategic Priority 3: Protecting and enhancing environmental quality
 - Strategic Priority 4: Reducing the need to travel, managing car use and promoting more sustainable modes of transport and improving the road network
- 3.2 Under each Strategic Priority there is a suite of indicators that monitor the progress of relevant Local Plan policies, as well as a range of indicators that provide a local context and monitor significant effects.
- 3.3 The three types of indicator used are:
 - core indicators these measure the achievement of policy actions in the Local Plan
 - contextual indicators these provide background data that may not be directly affected by the Local Plan itself
 - significant effects indictors these monitor the significant effects of the Local Plan and are used in the Sustainability Appraisal baseline. These can be core or contextual as well as stand alone.
- 3.4 Each indicator has a unique reference number related to the Strategic Priority it falls under (for example "EP1") and a designation of indicator type (core, contextual, significant effect). In addition, where appropriate, a target or trend to be achieved has been added, along with an information source that the Council will use to monitor the indicator. A reference is also made to the specific policies the indicator monitors and the local plan document that these policies are contained within (such as the LPS or SADPD).

Indicator targets and trends

- 3.5 For policies where clear outputs are required, such as those relating to housing delivery, specific targets have been included in the LPMF. Performance against such targets can inform whether Local Plan policies should be reviewed.
- 3.6 For policies where it is not possible to attach a clear target, a general trend has been included in the LPMF to identify whether a broad direction of travel is being met. This can include either an increase or a decrease in a recorded indicator.

- 3.7 For other indicators that provide helpful background data, neither a target nor a trend is appropriate.
- 3.8 The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government have published the 'Town and Country Planning (Use Classes)(Amendment)(England) Regulations 2020', bringing a raft of changes to the use class system in relation to high street uses. The changes take effect from the 1 September 2020 and could affect the retail based indicators. While we have not been able to take account of them in this version of the LPMF as their publication has coincided with the Council's deadline for completing work on the SADPD for internal approval and consultation, they will be included in the next revision of the LPMF document.

Meeting targets

- 3.9 Where it would appear through monitoring that targets are not being met, it may be necessary to:
 - review the policies in the Local Plan⁴ to see if they need to be amended in order to deliver the Strategic Priorities
 - consider alternative strategies
 - take appropriate management action to remedy the cause of underperformance.
- 3.10 This will be identified in the AMR.
- 3.11 The need to update policies or take appropriate management action will take into account evidence on likely future delivery, for example information on granting of planning permissions and feedback from developers on the prospects for the implementation of schemes.

Indicator sources

3.12 For each indicator a source of information is identified, which is considered, in the main, to be easily obtainable on a yearly basis or more frequently. If information is available less regularly, then the date to which the information applies and the date on which the information was published will be clearly shown. Sources include national statistics and information collected/held by the Council. If the information source changes or the information is no longer available, then this will be noted in the AMR and addressed in a review of the LPMF.

4. Local Plan Monitoring Framework

Table 4.1 details the LPMF. It is split by Strategic Priority and then by indicator type (core, contextual and significant 4.1 effects⁵). It is intended that this format will be followed in the yearly AMR produced and published by the Council.

5. Reviewing the LPMF

- 5.1 It is anticipated that the LPMF will be reviewed periodically, using the latest AMR as a starting point. The following activities could trigger the need for an update to the LPMF:
 - the adoption or revision of a Local Plan document
 - the discontinuing of an existing data source for providing indicator information
 - the availability of a new data source that could improve Local Plan policy monitoring
- 5.2 This LPMF is being published at the same time as the Revised Publication Draft SADPD. The LPMF may be subject to further revision as the Revised Publication Draft SADPD undergoes an examination in public (expected to take place in mid 2021) and its subsequent steps leading to adoption. Any revisions to the LPMF resulting from revisions to the SADPD policies or the other influences referred to above will be set out in a future version of this document.
